Tell us about your business.

Evolve Paleo Chef is a weekly meal delivery service with no contracts or minimums. Clients order online by 10 a.m. Friday, and pick up or have their food delivered on either Sunday or Monday. Evolve focuses on the Paleo lifestyle. The Paleo diet has no processed sugars, dairy or wheat, making it the No. 1 diet for those looking to become healthier.

What should potential customers know about your company?

Although most of the clients order and pick up or have their food delivered on Sunday or Monday, you can stop in our location any day to pick up an entrée or snack. Our entrees are pre-made and in individual servings, are always fresh, never frozen. We would be happy to heat up your entrée or you can take it back to your office to heat up in a microwave or toaster oven.

What would surprise people about Evolve Paleo Chef?

Evolve was started out of a house kitchen and garage and through word of mouth, now has seven locations in five states, ships nationwide and has pantry items in grocery stores including Whole Foods and Natural Grocers. Evolve was started four years ago by a doctor and a chef with the intent of bringing healthy food to as many people as possible. Evolve has about 140 employees and has a goal of opening 10 to 15 new franchise locations in 2017.
