Q & A with Peter Arch, CEO of Challenger Sports, and Paul Lawrence, CEO of Challenger Teamwear

Tell us about your business.

<u>Challenger Sports</u> is an American company run predominantly by British people who have a passion for soccer. Originally "British Soccer Camps" in 1985, the company was renamed Challenger Sports in 1997 and now provides soccer coaching services and products to more than 200,000 players each year. Challenger runs camps, clinics, tours, tournaments, team training and equipment to around 3,000 soccer clubs throughout the U.S. and Canada.

<u>Challenger Teamwear</u> is a sister company of Challenger Sports and has staff that work together to promote each company's business. Founded in 2002, Teamwear supplies its own brand of soccer uniforms to clients across the country. Recently the company became a supplier of Under Armour products, and has started to produce its own line of baseball and basketball uniforms.

How many employees do you have?

Challenger Sports has 25 full-time employees at the Lenexa office, and another 60 at 12 offices located throughout the U.S., England and Brazil. We employ more than 1,200 part-time soccer coaches from the United Kingdom and Brazil in the summer.

Challenger Teamwear has 75 full-time staff in the Lenexa office and 20 salespeople in Challenger Sports/Teamwear offices.

What should potential customers know about you?

Challenger Sports is running more than 50 soccer camps in the Kansas City area for players of all ages and abilities.

In addition to providing quality, low-cost sports uniforms for youth programs in the region, Challenger Teamwear can also provide fan gear, spirit wear or corporate gear to local businesses. We have our own print shop on site so all embellishment is produced in-house in Lenexa allowing for a fast turnaround of T-shirts, hoodies, etc.
